

# Outdoor Water Use Restored... Common Sense Water Restrictions Remain in Effect



As California nears the fifth year of a state-wide drought, several water agencies, including Temescal Valley Water District (TVWD), have been working with the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB), to implement a program for self-certification, based on an individual agency's available water supply.

The State is still under a drought emergency as mandated by Gov. Brown; however, in May the SWRCB changed the conservation requirement due to a wetter hydrology in Northern California. The revisions of the state water use restrictions, combined with the adoption of TVWD's resolution to change stages in the water conservation program means some relief for TVWD customers.


In early July 2016, TVWD's Board of Directors adopted a resolution to implement Stage I-Normal Conservation Conditions with a voluntary 10% conservation from the 2014 base year's use.

TVWD customers can now apply the amount of water that is necessary to maintain a healthy landscape, while continuing to use water wisely and to practice water conservation measures to prevent the waste and unreasonable use of water.

## COMMON SENSE WATER RESTRICTIONS

-  No landscape water runoff
-  No hosing down driveways or patios
-  No watering during or within 48 hours after rain

**The application of potable, non-potable or recycled water to outdoor landscapes that causes runoff, such that water flows onto adjacent property, non-irrigated areas, private and public walkways, roadways, parking lots or structures is PROHIBITED.**

**All residential and non-residential irrigation such as Parks, HOA maintained areas, recreation fields and school grounds shall be scheduled between the hours of 9 PM and 6 AM.**

In the coming months, TVWD will be working hand-in-hand with customers to educate them on the new water supply allocation, water use reporting requirements and what effect it will have on tiered water rates.

TVWD provides water supply, wastewater disposal and water resource management to the public in a safe, reliable, environmentally sensitive and financially responsible manner.
